- 3. REPORTS FROM DEPARTMENT HEADS: Foreman Pink had no report. Mayor Carter asked him how the equipment is running. Foreman Pink stated that the sander truck was in for repairs for u-joints, etc. but that we have it back in operation.

Motion by Kealy to hold a Special Council Meeting on January 31, 2023 at 6:00 p.m. to speak with the candidates and make the council appointment. Supported by Towner. Motion carried unanimously.
- O. Culture & Tourism Grant. Discussion. Mayor Carter stated that if there is an opportunity for funding the city should take a look at it. He spoke with Jim Plummer of the IRRRB regarding Mineland Reclamation grants and discussed if our dock and trails need work. The Culture & Tourism grant mentions historic preservation and there has been a lot of discussion of City Hall needing repairs. Councilor Towner suggested if there is a possibility of a new city public safety/works building that we hold off on City Hall and wait until the fall submission. Councilor Towner stated that the recreation board is working on a grant proposal. There was a question on how many grant submissions we can have. Finance Manger Thronson said she would look into this. No action taken.
- P. Councilor's Comments. Councilor Kealy stated that kids were sliding down a snow hill onto Pennsylvania Avenue and just laying in the street. She asked parents to talk to their children and asked if the city crew could put a snow pile to block the kids from sliding out onto the road and also cautioned drivers to be on the look out. She also thanked the city crew for taking snow out of the ends of the sidewalks. Councilor Towner asked Foreman Pink if there is a possibility of getting a snow pile near the upper rink for sliding. Foreman Pink stated that it is in the works.
- Q. Mayor's Comments. Mayor Carter thanked everyone for stepping up and volunteering to serve on the boards.
